From Ham register 1958; Band Leader and RCA Marine Radio Dealer. USCG Auxiliary, U.S. Power Squadron; Civilian Police; Kiwanis; VFW - West Lake Yacht Club; Prior Service USNR - a son and one daughter. Hobbies included Photography, Navigation, Instructor Boating; USCG Auxiliary. Operated the National Air Races in Cleveland.

Enlisted US Military 1942-1945 - It was noticed Red had remarks in this QSL dated March of 1953 that he was a Band Leader. Further checks revealed a Piano Musician, Orchestra Leader, Music teacher. Appears he was not a nationwide figure.

It was found Red's final days were in Long term care facilities N. Olmstead Ohio. We have a few QSL cards on hand. Our QSL dated 1953 (Courtesy K8CX Collection) stated Doyle was using an RCA RadioMarine transceiver on 160 meters, Model ET8044 which appears.
