Tom, on occasion I've noticed a nifty QSL card by VE9GW an early Canadian International Voice on 6090 Khz, from 5 to 9 PM daily. It was of the low power presence variety of CFRX/CFRB channel 6070 Khz provincial relay much later on. In reviewing old station log's of the 30's I've often seen Broadcaster VE9GW listed as a Canadian catch. It varied (QSL'd) 100 percent.

Old friend and CW pal W2RBK (George Cook of Syracuse NY) wrote; In the early days around 1930 I used to listen to VE9GW, a Canadian shortwave broadcast station located in Bowmanville, Ontario, a small town opposite Buffalo on the shore of Lake Ontario. I never knew much about it other than it was strong in these parts. It would appear that Canadian shortwave broadcasting was active at least as early as 1930-31.

For the record there was a notice that VE9GW would close down January 15<sup>th</sup> 1933 on the 49 Meter band., per W.A.Shane station manager. CKGW would continue on owned by Gooderham and Worts the same owners of VE9GW. Ironic, in 2008 EBAY is offering a VE9GW card. It still goes on and on. Long live the hobby.
